Burglary of a Building Arrest

Wednesday, March 19, 2025

On Monday, March 10, 2025 around 7:00 a.m., an officer was patrolling the area around Lexington Square Apartments when he observed a black male exiting the west door. Upon seeing the patrol unit, the black male fled northwest from the officer. Other units responded to the area to attempt to locate the male.

The Department recently implemented a Drone as First Responder (DFR) Program so the drone was launched to the area to assist in the search. Utilizing the drone's thermal imaging capabilities, the male was located lying in a field north of the apartment complex and was quickly taken into custody. This male initially provided a false name, but was later identified as Rahsaan Lackey, 32 of San Antonio.

While officers were investigating the burglary at Lexington Square, another burglary was reported at Grayhill Apartments. This office had been forcefully entered as well and a safe had been taken.

Officers realized a vehicle was likely involved with the burglary due to a safe being stolen. Officers began checking the area and located a U-Haul truck backed into a parking spot near the Lexington Square office. The temperature that morning was cool and most vehicles in the parking lot had frosted windows except for this truck. A male subject was located lying down in the front seat of the vehicle and was identified as Travis William Marvin, 36 of San Antonio. Marvin was found to be in possession of narcotics and was taken into custody for Possession of a Controlled Substance.

The subsequent investigation located a vast amount of stolen property inside the U-haul including the safe taken from Grayhill Apartments. In addition, checks, money orders and cash totaling more than 1.2 million dollars were recovered from the vehicle. Items recovered were from areas between San Antonio to Love County, Oklahoma.

Lackey's charges include:

- San Antonio warrant for Burglary of a Habitation
- San Antonio warrant for Unauthorized Use of a Vehicle
- San Antonio warrant for Possession of a Controlled Substance.
- Burglary of a Building (State Jail Felony)
- Fraudulent Use/Possession of Identifying Information (Felony 1)
- Evading Arrest (Class A Misdemeanor)
- Failure to Identify Fugitive Intent False Information (Class A Misdemeanor)

Our investigators continue to work with other agencies and additional charges are anticipated.
